

Points of Interest

Points of Interest along the Trails at Watershed Preserve Park

- Stream - all water leaving Watershed Preserve Park:
It divides downstream, some travels East to the Belle River to Lake Huron, and some goes South East through Secord Lake, Stoney Creek Park, the Clinton River and finally Lake St. Clair.
 - At Orange Trail Marker 2
- White Pine Tree:
Common Native Tree
 - At Yellow Trail Marker 30
 - Along path East side of Slating Lake, North of Dock, near yellow trail marker 24
- Vernal Pond or Pool:
Breeding grounds for amphibians and reptiles. Lots of activity in the spring. Usually becomes dry in late summer.
 - Orange Trail near Marker 4
 - West of Trail Purple Marker 22, down by path on East side of Slating Lake
- Largest Oak Tree:
Oak (Species to be determined)
 - North of Yellow Trail Marker 24, West of Beaver Dam
- Highest Elevation:
GPS Elevation to be determined
 - On Purple Trail near Trail Marker 19
- Large Red Oak Tree:
Common Native Tree in a Mature Forest
 - Along path East side of Slating Lake, North of dock
- Large Cut Oak Tree on the Trail:
Count the rings to see how old it was (count to be determined)
 - On Trail near Marker 35
- Glacial Large Rock:
 - West of Purple Trail Marker 22, near path down to East side of Slating Lake
- Red Pine Trees:
Not Native, Planted about 1980
 - Near Yellow Trail Marker Yellow 31
- Cattails & Phragmites:
Located near each other
 - West of Purple Trail Marker 22, along East side of Slating Lake
- Autumn Olive Bush:
 - Close to Orange Trail Marker 3
- Oriental Bittersweet:
 - North of Orange Trail Marker 2
- Paper Birch Tree:
 - West side of Parking Lot, North of Green Gate
- Tamarack Tree:
 - Between Cell Tower and Rochester Road, to the North
